
Evaluation of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in School District of Philadelphia


- There are ~380,000 sudden cardiac arrests (SCA) in the US a year with a survival rate of 10-12%. If witnessed in a school with AEDs and a Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP) the survival rate increases to 80-85%.
- 1 in 70 high schools will have a SCA each year.
- 20% of the population can be found daily on a school campus, so implementation of AEDs and CERP in schools can save as many as 50,000 deaths each year.
- A school has a sufficient number of AEDS if they have one AED per 500 students.
- A rescue-ready (RR) AED is less than 10 years old and does not have expired batteries or pads.
- Pennsylvania General Assembly Act 35 of 2014 required all Pennsylvania Schools to report the number, condition, age, and placement of their AEDs.

Methods


- The **objective** of this study is to assess the AEDs in Philadelphia public schools to ensure that they can become **Heart Safe**.
- Data from the School District of Philadelphia (SDP) was analyzed from their Google Sheets database.
- The study population included 219 schools and their 354 AEDs.
- Statistical analysis was performed using Stata Statistical Software: Release 17. College Station, TX: StataCorp LLC.

Key Points

- •Of the 99% of the SDP schools that have at least one AED, 61% have at least one Rescue Ready AED.
- •Of the 92% of SDP schools have a sufficient number of AEDs, 54% have a sufficient number of Rescue Ready AEDs.
- •50.3% of the 354 AEDs in SDP are Rescue Ready.
- •56 AEDs and XX schools can immediately become rescue ready with the **replacement of expired** pads.

Discussion/Conclusions

- •This study demonstrates the importance of education surrounding long-term maintenance of AEDs.
- Maintaining a Rescue Ready AED involves ensuring that its three components (pads, batteries and units) are up-to-date and not expired.
- The SDP has ensured that the majority of their schools have a sufficient number of AEDs, but to become Heart Safe they should ensure all their AEDs are Rescue Ready.
