Fellows become members of the Wolf Undergraduate Humanities Forum, a community of undergrads who meet to discuss and present their research, pursue various cultural activities of common interest, and occasionally meet in special receptions with the Wolf Humanities Center's distinguished speakers. The year's program culminates in a spring conference at which students give formal presentations on the results of their research.

Fellows are required to attend and participate in meetings, which during the 2022–23 academic year will be every other Friday from 2:00–4:00pm, as well as the Undergraduate Humanities Forum Research Conference scheduled for Friday, March 24, 2023. Additional opportunities and outings for fellows will be announced during the year. Students must be full time, on campus for the full academic year of the award, and in good academic standing.
