


## Relationship between Early Exposure to Violence and Later Antisocial and Criminal Behavior

#### INTRODUCTION

- ➤ 50 to 96% of urban youth have exposure to community violence (ECV).¹
- ➤ ECV is correlated with increased externalizing behavior and a moderate increase in internalizing behaviors.¹

The current project had 2 goals:



# Exposure to gun or knife violence over 15 years is associated with:

- Increased antisocial behavior in young adulthood.
- Increased likelihood of holding an arrest record in an unadjusted model.

➤ When adjusting for covariates, ECV was associated with increased antisocial behavior in only the Black and White subgroups.

### METHOD

- > Correlational study
  - ➤ Subjects: AddHealth dataset²
  - ➤ Data pulled: ECV, race, antisocial behavior, age, sex, income, criminal arrests, physical assault, intimate partner violence
- Design: ordinary least squares regression analysis; same-sex sibling fixed-effect model

#### DISCUSSION

- The relationship between ECV and antisocial behavior was strengthened with a sibling fixed-effect analysis.
- > Stringent criminal arrest analysis limited robustness of results.
- The most effective interventions will target younger youth with high ECV and high baseline antisocial behavior.
